About the Presenters:

Eddie Hawkins and **Sandra Johnson** have been school resource officers and DARE instructors for the past 6 years. Both presenters have the opportunity to touch the lives of youth daily. With over 20 years experience working with youth, they have encountered everything from honor roll students to gang members. They have conducted training on local and national levels in regards to dealing with youth. Both have been state certified in drugs, mediation, instructors, and gangs.

About the Workshop:

The goal of this course is to improve the participants' ability to recognize juvenile aggression and deescalate confrontations. Participants will be equipped with specific deescalating techniques to contain even the most violent juveniles. Implementation of these techniques should decrease future instances. This is an interactive course. Through powerpoint presentations, audience engagement, and real life demonstration, participants will have a clear understanding of science and techniques for deescalation.

Objectives:

Participants will be able to:

- Identify physical and psychological changes that occur in juveniles in regards to aggression.
- Understand the generational gap and how it affects dealing with juvenile aggression.
- Explore specific techniques to deescalate juvenile aggression.
- Understand the power of follow up after an occurrence of aggression.
